A Message from Fr. Bill

December 2023

Dear Parishioners,

As you read this annual report, I hope that you will recognize the many ways we intentionally encountered Christ and showed loved to one another and our greater community during the Year of Encounter.

Although our annual theme has shifted, we are not leaving behind the goals we set for the year. Encounter must continue to be, in the words of Pope Francis, our greatest desire for ourselves and our greatest gift to others.

This sincere gift of self was mirrored in the ways we shared our precious time, talent, and treasure through our stewardship of prayer, service, and sacrificial giving throughout the year:

- volunteers made weekly visits to nursing homes, prayed with men in prison, made casseroles for the homeless, settled refugees into new homes, and crafted blankets for those who were hurting;
- students in the fourth grade at Saint Pius X Catholic School focused their stewardship on people with disabilities and the organizations that support them;
- we continued to share a portion of our parish tithe with St. Adalbert, our sister parish;
- we prayed each week during Mass for Palestinian Christians in the Holy Land; and
- we donated hundreds of pounds of food to the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry, gave Christmas gifts to those in need, and provided diapers and baby items to Hannah's House and the Women's Care Center.

As a parish, we also had fun at events such as the Feast of Saint Pius X at the the outdoor Mass, picnic, and the 5K Flyin' Lion Race. We also enjoyed Welcome Weekends, fish frys, spaghetti dinners, pancake breakfasts and trivia and euchre nights. And we encountered each other and Christ at Mass, during our Advent and Lenten series, the parish book program and at Adoration and Exposition.

Please join me in a prayer of gratitude for the many opportunities God has given us to encounter Him and each other during the past year. And let us also pray that we may continue the good work He has begun in us.







Your gifts to the 2022 Giving Tree served 500 children and 200 families at St. Adalbert and through St. Vincent de Paul in South Bend. You donated \$6,615 to buy additional presents and grocery store gift cards for the families.

Saint Pius Shares

Through Saint Pius Shares, our parish distributes 8.5 percent of the offertory to various programs, serving diverse needs outside of the parish. As part of the Diocesan Twinning Program, 5 percent is given to support St. Adalbert Catholic School in South Bend. In addition, 3.5 percent is distributed to various local, national and international needs of the poor as recommended by the Parish Financial Resources Committee. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the amount increased to 9 percent, with 4 percent distributed to St. Adalbert, 4 percent to needs of the poor and 1 percent to

Palestinian Christians in the Holy Land.

Other Ways We Gave

- The Refugee Resettlement Ministry helped set up homes for five, large families—four from Afghanistan and one from the Republic of the Congo—with furniture, household goods and other donations from parishioners.
- You also donated hundreds of diapers, clothes, shoes and baby items in October for the Respect Life Baby Shower. The items went to clients at the Women's Care Center, Hannah's House and the Christ Child Society.
- The Covered in Prayer Blanket Ministry made 75 blankets for parishioners who needed comfort.
- Volunteers made hundreds of meals for Hope Ministries, the Center for the Homeless, funerals and parishioners experiencing difficult circumstances in their lives.
- Hundreds of pounds of food were donated during


- the monthly collection for the Saint Pius Conference of St. Vincent de Paul Society. The poor fund distributed to SPX parishioners in need or living in poverty helped pay for temporary financial support for utilities, housing, medical bills, food, daycare and more.
- You donated 3,476 diapers to the Christ Child Diaper Drop.
- Your gifts of more than \$75,000 to the Scholarship Granting Organization of Northeast Indiana helped the children of 28 families attend Saint Pius X Catholic School.
- You donated \$15,690 to Fr. Arthur Joseph Ssembajja's mission appeal for the chapel at Saint John the Evangelist Seminary in Uganda and \$55,760 for Fr. Augustine's appeal to help parishes and families affected by flooding in Nigeria.

Fiscal Year 2023 Financial Notes

- Offertory income, which **increased by 13 percent** from the prior fiscal year, accounted for 75 percent of the total parish income.
- Cash on hand at the end of the fiscal year was \$3,174,119, an increase of \$1,404, 430.
- Building campaign pledges of \$323,635 received are excluded from income because they were used to pay off the contruction loan. Pledge payments accounted for 7 percent of total parish income.
- Donations and bequests of \$326,905 accounted for 7 percent of total parish income.
- Donations to the Saint Pius Chapter of the St. Vincent de Paul Society were \$197,119 or 4 percent of parish income.
- Enrollment at Saint Pius X Catholic School grew by 14 students to 538 in grades kindergarten through eight, which was a **2.7 percent increase**. The cost to educate one child in 2022-2023 was \$8,481.
- Indiana School Choice Scholarships were given to 212 students and totaled \$1,123,380. The parish provided financial aid to 99 students at a cost of \$214,565, while 34 students received \$75,260 in Scholarship Granting Organization grants. Staff discounts for 45 children equalled \$260,600.
- Total school income **increased by 13 percent** to \$524,168 because of increased enrollment and additional funding from choice scholarships. Total expenses increased by 9 percent due to higher costs for software and teaching, as well as pay raises for certified teachers and support staff.
- Fixed asset additions of \$206,760 included a new exterior sign for the parish, carpet in the Parish Education Center, a new bathroom in the preschool, handbells, two Automated External Defibrillators, HVAC equipment and a new washer and dryer for the rectory.
- Parish expenses increased by 9 percent. Payroll and benefits, as well as additional activities throughout parish ministries, account for the additional costs.



2019-2024 Strategic Plan

The 2019-2024 Strategic Plan was released in 2019 and serves as a five-year guide for the work of the parish. We have completed year four of the plan. The following are the objectives in each area and some of the accomplishments from the past year.

Liturgy and Worship

Saint Pius X Parish seeks to bring God's Word to life in the liturgy, worship, and the Sacraments.

- In October 2022, Francesca LaRosa spoke with school children on active participation in the Mass. She also did reflections with our middle school music students and for the entire Parish Music Ministry.
- In February 2023, we offered a presentation on the Paschal cycle: Lent, Easter Triduum and Easter.



- In June 2023, we began development of children's activity bags for Masses for use beginning in September of 2023.
- In June 2023, we began development of a worship aid for children and those with physical and intellectual disabilities to be unveiled during Advent of 2023.

Stewardship

Saint Pius X Parish will shape the growth of true Christian stewardship among all parishioners through prayer, service, and sacrificial giving.

- The parish bulletin includes monthly updates of parish offertory collections, budget and poor-fund distribution in a continued effort to ensure financial transparency.
- To help parishioners learn more about financial stewardship and sacrificial giving, we offered an opportunity to participate in a 9-week series of Financial Peace University.
- In the spring of 2023, we began creating materials on planned giving for parishwide distribution in early 2024.
- In September 2022, we sponsored the second annual Day of Service that brought together parishioners of all ages to help a variety of ministries within the parish and in the greater community.

Operations

Saint Pius X Parish will provide appropriate staff, facilities, and parish operations to create a welcoming and evangelizing atmosphere that enhances our Catholic identity while maintaining responsible stewardship of parish resources.

Business

- The church loan was paid off in March 2023, well ahead of the November 2024 maturity date, because of the generosity of parishioners.
- An increase was approved to raise the parish tithe for the poor from 8.5 percent to 9 percent.
- We made access to the parish guest WiFi easier.
- A new Employee Handbook for parish staff is making progress.
- We updated the employee performace review process.

Facilities

Our facilities team continued to maintain our beautiful church and update our grounds to meet the needs of the parish. Some highlights from this year's facilities updates include:

- A new parish sign was installed along Fir Road (and a new mailbox with signage) to help increase visibility and help welcome visitors to the parish.
- The main entrance to the parish life center was reengineered to better accommodate funeral processions.
- A number of offices and classrooms received new carpeting and paint to keep them looking new and inviting.
- Ongoing maintenance for the heating and cooling systems across our campus kept our staff and contractors busy this year!
- Fluorescent lights were replaced with longer-lasting and more energy efficient LED units in the Parish Education Center.
- The Multipurpose Room received new acoustic panels (featuring images from the church) to help decrease echo and allow more groups to use the space. The Stations of the Cross from our old church were installed in the MP room as well to allow more opportunities for prayer.
- Ongoing updates to our daycare house, youth house, and rectory helped keep our children, teens, and clergy safe and warm!

Engagement

Saint Pius X Parish will provide opportunities for all to build a deeper sense of Christian community in an evangelizing, welcoming, and inclusive environment.

- As part of our Love Your Neighbor program, we are making regular outreach to new parishioners.
- Plans for a new welcome center in the PEC are underway.
- We created a video series for the Year of Encounter that focused on how parishioners encounter the parish and each other.
- We offered events such as Summer Sports Night and Pizza, Prayer and Play to help parishioners encounter one another in new ways.
- We began development of a new, more user-friendly website.
- We continued to support all parish ministries in their communications efforts.

- We revamped Welcome Weekend to encourage parishwide participation by offering food and children's activities.
- We hired an assistant director of engagement to focus on ways to better communicate with parishioners and keep them involved in the life of the parish.
- We began a Catholic in Recovery ministry that serves members of the Saint Pius community and other parishes the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend by offering hope and healing for those recovering from addictions, compulsions and unhealthy attachments.

Faith Formation

Saint Pius X Parish will enable parishioners to encounter Christ, grow in their Catholic faith, and live as disciples in the world through a comprehensive approach to lifelong faith formation.

- We recruited a Returning Catholics volunteer team to invite, support and advocate for the needs of disaffiliated Catholics
- We established an adult Confirmation program, which will assist Catholic adults seeking to complete their Christian initiation each spring.
- We expanded seasonal and ongoing Adult Faith Formation opportunities through the launch of monthly Catechism Chats and a spring book study on Brandon Vogt's *Return: How to Draw Your Child Back to the Faith.*
- We offered multi-generational and family oriented opportunities to grow in faith, especially through the visit of Catholic speaker Meg Hunter-Kilmer
- We began an annual mini-retreat to orient parish leaders to the parishwide theme and facilitate networking among diverse ministries and groups.
- We expanded parent preparation for sacraments to allow for peer sharing and deeper parent engagement.
- We began hosting monthly young adult social events, focusing on outreach to young adults at the parish and in the wider community.
- We ran our second College Crew Speaker Series for students returning to the area for summer break.
- Volunteers began a monthly parishwide Exposition with Praise and Worship ministry.
